## False Sunflower

Heliopsis helianthoides

Light: Full Sun

Soil: Sand, Loam, Clay

Moisture: Dry, Medium, Moist

Benefits: Pollinators, Butterflies, Birds, Host Plant

Height: 3'-6'

Blooms: Jun, Jul, Aug, Sep

Zones: 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8

Color: Yellow

Spacing: 1'

Root: Fibrous

A member of the Aster family, False Sunflower is a relative of the true sunflower *Helianthus* and is also known as Ox Eye Sunflower, Ox-eye Daisy or Smooth Oxeye. The plant is easily grown in average, dry to medium, well-drained soil in full sun and does best if watered regularly. Flowers bloom throughout the summer.

False Sunflower is considered one of the best hardy plants for a wildflower garden border. Staking may be necessary in shady locations. The nectar attracts butterflies and other pollinators, birds utilize the seed as a food source, and stems provide winter cover for beneficial insects.
