## Pale Purple Coneflower

Echinacea pallida

Light: Full Sun, Partial Shade

Soil: Sandy, Loam, Rocky

Moisture: Dry, Medium

Benefits: Pollinators, Birds, Deer Resistant

Height: 2-3'

Blooms: Jun, Jul

Zones: 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10

Color: Pale Purple

Spacing: 10-18"

Root: Tap root

A pollinator favorite, Pale Purple Coneflower is an adaptable plant that is tolerate of drought, heat, humidity and poor soils. The leaves host caterpillars, the flowers attract hummingbirds, and the seed heads attract goldfinch.

Best flower display is in late June to late July. The plant freely selfseeds and should be divided when overcrowded. Pair with Purple Coneflower for a continuous bloom from summer through fall.
