Red Milkweed

Asclepias incarnata

Light: Full Sun, Partial Sun

Soil: Rich Loam, Sandy Loam

Moisture: Wet, Medium-Wet, Medium

Benefits: Butterflies, Bees, Birds, Pollinators

Height: 4'

Blooms: Jun, Jul, Aug

Zones: 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9

Color: Pink

Spacing: 18" to 36"

Root: Taproot

Also known as Swamp Milkweed or Rose Milkweed, Red Milkweed has a lovely vanilla fragrance and is a larval host for Monarch and Swallowtail butterflies. In addition, the plant has been designated as special value to native bees, bumble bees and honey bees by the Pollinator Program of The Xerces Society for Invertebrate Conservation.

Growing best in wetter conditions, Red Milkweed will tolerate temporary flooding and is a great choice for rain gardens and low spots or other moist areas in the landscape. Once established, the plant will be difficult to transplant due to its taproot.
