



Jacob's Ladder

Polemonium reptans

With its bell-shaped flowers, compound leaves, and foliage that stays fresh and green all summer, Jacob's Ladder is a great addition to a home garden in dappled sun or light shade or on the north side of the house. It can also be paired with Jack-in-the-Pulpit in woodlands and woodland edges. For best results, plant in loamy soil with decaying leaves and mulch with leaves.

Jacob's Ladder is a great source of nectar and pollen due to its early bloom time and is of special value to native bees and bumblebees.

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
