

Common Ninebark

Physocarpus opuliflorus



Light:	Full sun, partial sun
Soil:	Clay, loam, sand
Moisture:	Medium wet, medium, medium dry
Benefits:	Pollinators, Birds, Deer Resistant, Host
Height:	8'
Blooms:	July
Zones:	3-8
Color:	White
Spacing:	4-6'
Root:	Fibrous

A true superplant. Ninebark is adaptable, gorgeous, and a boon to wildlife. Clusters of tiny white-to-pink flowers cover it in spring and are frequented by pollinators, including mining bees, and its a host plant for many moths. The reddish brown bark peels to show several layers, thus its name. Plus it's easy to grow. Perfect for adding that all-important shrub layer to your garden.
