Light:	Full, Partial
Soil:	Sand, Rocky
Moisture:	Medium, Medium-Dry, Dry
Benefits:	Host Plant, Rabbit and Deer Resistant
Height:	3'
Blooms:	Jul, Aug, Sept
Zones:	4, 5, 6, 7, 8
Color:	Silvery Green
Spacing:	1' to 2'
Root:	Rhizome

Prairie Sage is an attractive accent plant and an excellent choice for isolated areas with poor dry soils where it can naturalize without overwhelming other plants. It spreads readily and can form dense colonies.

Prairie Sage is a host plant for the American Lady butterfly. It is the species of sage used in smudging ceremonies and in sage bundles for many Native American tribes.
