



Stiff Goldenrod

Oligoneuron rigidum

Light:	Full Sun
Soil:	Clay, Loam, Sand
Moisture:	Medium Wet–Dry
Benefits:	Pollinators, Butterflies, Hummingbirds, Deer Resistant
Height:	3-5'
Blooms:	Aug, Sep
Zones:	3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8,9
Color:	Yellow
Spacing:	1'
Root:	Fibrous



Like all goldenrods, this U.P. native is a pollinator magnet and a superb resource for native bees and butterflies, including Monarchs.

If you give it enough sun, Stiff Goldenrod is the opposite of fussy. It won't take over like some goldenrods, but it does reseed, so you might have to deadhead or pull unwanted seedlings. The blossoms begin as pale yellow buds that look especially attractive above the gray-green foliage, then open to bright yellow bumblebee beacons.
