## Ohio Spiderwort

Tradescantia ohiensis

Light:	Full sun, partial sun
Soil:	Clay, loam, sand
Moisture:	Dry, medium, moist
Benefits:	Pollinators, Birds, Deer Resistant
Height:	2-4'
Blooms:	June-July
Zones:	3-9
Color:	Blue-lavender
Spacing:	1'
Root:	Fibrous

Not as aggressive as other spiderworts, Ohio spiderwort still enjoys flexing its muscles, so maybe this isn't the best plant for a small garden. Nevertheless, if you plant it with other study customers, you'll be rewarded with lovely blooms and unusual foliage. Excellent with smooth penstemon. Dies back later in summer, so consider adding some grasses and/or laterblooming forbs to extend the season.
