

Blue False Indigo

Blue False Indigo is a large, bushy perennial, with clusters of deep blue flowers on long upright spikes. In its first few years, this long-lived plant develops mostly below ground. After the first two seasons the blooms are increasingly showy as the plant matures into a shrub-like form around 4' high. The bluish-green foliage is very attractive and provides a good backdrop to other flowering plants. It makes a strong statement as a specimen plant in formal designs, and is beautiful in a naturalized setting, as well.
