Great Blue Lobelia

Lobelia siphilitica

Light: Full Sun, Partial Sun

Soil: Clay, Loam, Sand

Moisture: Medium, Moist

Benefits: Pollinators, Butterflies, Hummingbirds, Deer

Resistant

Height: 1'-4'

Blooms: Jul, Aug, Sep

Zones: 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9

Color: Blue, violet-blue

Spacing: 1'

Root: Fibrous

Yet another example of a show-stopping flower that prefers damp soils. Spectacular while in bloom, especially when paired with its sister, cardinal flower (*Lobelia cardinalis*). Bonus: great blue lobelia is longer—lived than its flame-red relative. It re-seeds happily but is not considered aggressive. Beloved by hummingbirds and bees, but not by deer. Whew.
