



White Snakeroot

Ageratina altissima

Excellent and attractive pollinator plant for many insects and a host to a variety of moths. Very adaptable and great for filling in shady areas, providing food for bees well into the fall. It is typically a plant of disturbed places, so it can reseed prolifically in certain situations; deadhead its lovely flowers and pull shoots to control its spread. White snakeroot is usually avoided by mammals (including deer and rabbits) because of its bitter taste. It is toxic to humans and livestock, so it's not recommended near pastures.
